














HGL Show to Welcome Spring And Support Local Business

Youth Leadership Students Honor Their Sponsors; HS Students Take Steps to Success; Foundation Prepares for Community Reading Day & 5th Grade Career Field Day

The program year for the Youth Leadership Bedford County Class of 2019 is winding down, but before they wrap up their sessions, the class took some time to thank the businesses who have made their experience possible.

More than a dozen of the program sponsors joined the class for lunch during their March session at Hoss's Steak and Sea House; each sponsor was presented with a plaque and listened while all of the students shared highlights of their experience in the program.

The Class then finished planning a fundraiser during the Chamber's Home Show to benefit the Bedford County Humane Society as their community service project.

The YLBC program has expanded in recent years to reach more 10th grade students through a Youth Leadership Summit. Fifty students, representing all Bedford County School Districts and chosen by their school faculty and administration, come together for a day of visioning and team building through interaction with community leaders.

The Summit, planned for April 30th at Homewood at Spring House Estates, is designed to empower students to become servant leaders, to make a positive difference in their communities, and to foster pride in Bedford County.


